The Corn Springs Campground is located deep in a canyon of the Chuckwalla Mountains and is situated by a stand of more than 60 native California fan palms. This oasis supports abundant wildlife and is an important stopping place for migratory birds. Corn Springs was a major occupation site of prehistoric Native American Indian groups. The petroglyphs at Corn Springs are one of the finest examples of rock art in the Colorado Desert. The campground is operated by the BLM and has two nice vault toilets, picnic tables, fire rings, and ramadas. It is 175 miles east of Claremont just south of I-10 at 500 ft elevation. Average January temperatures are 65 high, 39 low. There is a limited water supply from a manual pump. Don't count on it; bring the water you will need.
