LAKE MEAD OUTING

SEPTEMBER 17-19, 2004

We will be camping on a beach outside of Callville Bay Marina on Lake Mead. Families are invited to attend this outing with the Troop. The individual drivers will set departure time on Friday. We will return on Sunday evening approximately 9pm. Class C Uniforms (Troop shirt) are required for travel between Claremont and camp both on Friday night and Sunday afternoon.

We currently plan to have three ski boats on this trip. Primary activities include water skiing, wakeboarding, kneeboarding, tubing, swimming, sunning, sitting, and relaxing (its a tough job, but somebody's gotta do it!). There are no shower, bathroom, changing, store, phone, fast food, television, espresso, or other facilities at the campsite. It is a beach, accessible only by boat. There is sand, sun, water, a few rocks, a few scrawny bushes, and the occasional burro.

The air temperature can vary from 70 to 115 degrees. Thunderstorms do sometimes occur. Pack as lightly and compactly as possible in a duffle bag. **Do not bring a pack frame.** All gear will be transported from the marina to camp in a boat. You must be able to carry everything you bring in one trip. Each person must bring a long sleeve shirt, long pants, and shoes that can get wet. Shoes must be worn at all times except when you are water skiing or in your sleeping bag. Anyone who wants to fish must have a current fishing license. These can be purchased at the marina.

Cooking will be done as a Troop. Leadership will plan the menu and do the shopping for the meals from Saturday breakfast through Sunday lunch. There will be no disposable eating utensils used. Each person must bring personal, reusable, eating utensils (cup, plate, silverware). Water, punch, and lemonade will be provided for drinking. Individuals wishing other beverages should bring their own in a **small** ice chest. We will stop for a fast food dinner on the way home Sunday night. Individual drivers may choose to stop for dinner on the way out Friday night. Scouts should bring money for these stops.

Transportation for this outing will be planned by patrols. Maps are available from Jim for the drivers. Each driver may determine a meeting place, departure time, travel itinerary, etc. Please inform Jim of your expected arrival time at Callville Bay Marina. We can meet you at the marina on Friday between 5:00pm and midnight. Caravanning is always recommended and it would be more convenient if most cars arrived at approximately the same time. If your expected arrival time changes at the last minute, please leave a message at 909-228-5070. If your arrival will be delayed past midnight, please make alternative arrangements for the night and we will pick you up at the marina on Saturday morning.

The outing fee for this trip is \$40 per person (\$30 to cover the cost of gas and ice and \$10 for food). Make checks for \$40 payable to "Troop 407, BSA". **The Outing Coordinator must receive checks and Parental Permission Forms by 9:00pm on Tuesday, September 14.**

Drivers' Information

Distance: Approximately 240 miles one way
Travel time: Approximately 4 hours
Directions: Interstate 15 North
Through Barstow
Through Baker
12 miles before reaching Las Vegas, take the
Henderson exit, Nevada 146
When you reach I-215, take it East (could be called South)
The freeway will end and dump you on Lake Mead Blvd
Continue through Henderson on Lake Mead Blvd
Lake Mead Blvd becomes Boulder Beach Hwy, Nevada 166
You will come to a Park Service tollbooth where you may need to pay a \$5 entrance fee
(depending on whether it is open when you get there).
Just after the booth, turn left on Nevada 147
At the fork, go straight/right on Nevada 167
Continue to the Callville Bay turnoff Marina (about 10 miles from the booth)
Turn right into the marina
Unload at the courtesy dock by the marina (not the launch ramp)
Park in the parking lot just above the marina
